Incumbent's Report

April 14, 2026

Grace and Peace to you all:

Easter and Holy Week have come and gone, and we still remain a people of Resurrection! We are coming into Spring where we will see new life budding and blooming before us. And I think this is what God and Jesus fully intended in the resurrection, that things are always becoming new. As part of that, old things must die and be transformed into new ones. We see this in the forests and the in the rivers, and well, just about everywhere in nature. But where do we fit in this cycle of renewal?

I suppose that depends on your trust in the resurrection. Pastor Steve Garnaas-Holmes said this about resurrection, "People ask, "So, if Jesus rose physically from the dead, where's his real, physical body?" The answer is: *us*. We are the real, physical body of the Risen Christ. Christ is no longer an individual, but a community." We are the resurrection and we have a short amount of time on this earth to transform not only ourselves, but those whom we come in contact with. And we, they, are never transformed by words, but by action. How do we receive the stranger? How do we treat the poor? Who do we see as our neighbor and how are they welcomed and accepted? As the resurrected body of Christ, people, outsiders, should be attracted to Jesus and to being transformed by how we accept them and treat them. I think we do a pretty good job of that in this parish and there is always room to do more!

Over the next few months, we will be experiencing a time of transition; a time of transformation as we experience the loss of one incumbent and prepare for a new one. One way of doing things will die and another will be born. And through this process, we will all be transformed into something new, how we love people through this process and receive people on the other side will determine how well we understand resurrection. I am anxious about what life will be for me when I depart this parish as its incumbent, and excited about the new possibilities that lie ahead. I would imagine you may have some of the same feelings. Regardless of how I feel, you feel, this will take place right before our eyes and we will be witnesses to the end of one thing and the beginning of another. How we do this matters to everyone for it will set the tone of what is to come. May this transformation be filled with love, and joy and peace and grace as God would want it.

As part of this transformation, I would ask you to search your hearts, to seek God's wisdom, and ask what you may be able to give to make this transition seamless. What do you have time to give to? What task might you take on to ensure the running of this place? This is your parish, your church, your community. It will become what you want it to become depending on what you are willing to give and to sacrifice. Many hands make light work and there is nothing more satisfying than working together for the common good. In a world that stresses individualism, community is more important than ever. Please be the hands and feet of Jesus, and be his resurrected body in this place that the world might see your example and become curious as to what this Jesus offers.

I leave you with this blessing:

May the Lord Jesus Christ who walks on wounded feet walk with us to the end of the road, may the Lord Jesus Christ who serves with wounded hands help us to serve one another, and may the Lord Jesus Christ who loves with a wounded heart be our love this day and always. May we see the face of Jesus in everyone we meet, and may they see the face of Jesus in us.

As always, I love serving in this place and serving with all of you! Let us go forward following the way of Jesus and spreading God's love!

Wardens' Report for Parish Council April 14, 2026 (March)

The first service of March – March 1st, Lent 2 – was taken by our Pastoral Associate the Reverend Canon Pat Martin, as our incumbent the Reverend Mark Lewis was at Holy Trinity Chapel. Mark led our 10:30 services on March 8th (Lent 3), March 15th (Lent 4), March 22nd (Lent 5) and March 29th (Passion/Palm Sunday). Palm Sunday service began with the congregation processing around the church, complete with palm branches, and the singing of All Glory, Laud and Honour, and the story of the Passion of Christ. The 10:30 services were live streamed on YouTube. There is coffee-time in the Church before the 10:30 service for those who wish to visit. Mark held Contemplative services at 9:00 on March 8th and 22nd, and service at the Hartford Retirement Residence at 10:30 on Tuesday March 3rd.

There were Coffee Morning Gospel Conversations on Tuesday mornings March 3rd, 10th, 17th, 24th and 31st when the regular group meets on Zoom to talk about the Gospel for the coming week.

Martha's Lunches welcomed guests in the Hall on Thursday March 5th, and in the Church on Thursday March 19th, doors opening at 11:00 and starting with coffee at 11:15 and lunch at 11:45.

The Lenten learning series *How Can We Be Salt and Light in a Broken World* continued Wednesdays at 1:00 p.m. with Week 2 *On Being Salt* held March 4th; Week 3 *On Being Light* March 11th; and Week 4 *On Being Salt and Light as a Parish in South Dundas in 2026* on March 18th. In Week 5 on March 25th, Frank Beaulne presented *a Lesson in Milk Bag Weaving* at Community Living.

Education for Ministry met folks joined the March 18th learning session and continued their meeting in the Vestry afterward.

The always-busy Martha's Closet opened the doors on Saturday March 28th from 9:00 – 11:00. Coffee and treats are served in the Church while the Closet is open in the Hall.

The Food and Loonie Collection for Community Food Share continued through the month. A collection jar was on the table in the back of the church (along with the box for food collection). Our donations are really needed by the community.

The cast of the Seaway Mystery Play, which will be a tribute to Wendy Gibb, continued to practice on March 1st and 15th (perhaps more often?) in preparation for the production to be held on the afternoon of April 25th at the Playhouse. Members of the Matilda Lions Club are joining in as well.

Jim Millard kindly put together the work of many contributors and had a very nice newsletter ready to go out before Easter.

Parish Council agreed to the replacement of the gas fireplace insert in Martha's House/the Hub/former Rectory after the fan stopped working. While the fireplace functions without the fan, it is at least 30 years old and we think a new insert will be safer and more efficient at providing heat in the building.

After a discussion about having a maintenance plan for the furnaces at St. James', Toshack Heating and Cooling came to clean and inspect the three furnaces. They determined we are eligible for their Guardian Plan if Parish Council wishes. While Mark has been buying and replacing furnace filters etc., the furnaces had not otherwise been cleaned and inspected for four years. We have noted to list this task when we are working on the job description for a new rector, along with snow removal responsibilities.

All the activity we note above, to hold worship services and these and other ministries in service to the congregation and the community, as well as trying to maintain the facilities and equipment we use, requires the participation and contributions of many. Our thanks to each and all of you, and especially to Mark and Pat, who set an amazing example of love and service for the rest of us to follow.
