Holy Week Schedule

Holy Week is the time when we walk with Jesus from the excitement of the Palm Procession and Last Supper to the anguish in the Garden of Gethsemane and the desolation of the Cross before arriving at the joy of the Resurrection.

March 29: 10:30 am ~ Palm/Passion Sunday

The service begins with the Liturgy of the Palms as we remember Jesus' entry into Jerusalem. People are invited to process around the church waving palms as we sing "All Glory, Laud and Honour". We then tell the story of the Passion of Christ.

April 2: 7:00 pm ~ Maundy Thursday

This service recalls the events of the night before Jesus died. We begin with foot-washing and then move to the Institution of the Last Supper. At the end of the service, we strip the altar and those who wish are invited to pray quietly in the church for one hour. We close with an Order of Compline and exit the church in silence.

April 3: 11:00 am ~ Good Friday

On Good Friday, the most solemn day of the church year, we assemble to remember the Passion of Our Lord as we journey with Jesus to His Crucifixion. We exit the church in silence.

April 4: 7:00 pm ~ Holy Saturday

This service begins outdoors (west door) with the lighting of the new fire. The Pascal candle is lit from the new fire and carried into the church.

April 5: 10:30am ~ Easter Day

This is the day we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord. Alleluias and Butterflies are unleashed and chocolate Easter eggs are waiting to be found!

(Butterflies are waiting to be coloured at the back of the church.)
